Refugee, Asylum, Refugee.	See below
Prejudice	Preconceived opinion that is not based on reason or actual experience.
Citizen	Someone who is a citizen of a particular country is legally accepted as belonging to that country.
Persecution	Hostility and ill-treatment, especially because of race or political or religious beliefs.
Collaboration	The action of working with someone to produce something.

The Jigsaw Charter

- We take turns to speak
- We use kind and positive words
- We listen to each other
- We have the right to pass
- We only use names when giving compliments or when being positive
- We respect each other's privacy (confidentiality)

REFUGEE

- Forced to leave their country
- Fleeing armed conflict or persecution
- Do not know where they'll end up

MIGRANT

- Choose to move
- No direct threat of persecution or death
- Mainly to improve their lives
- Finding work

ENVIRONMENTAL MIGRANT

- Fleeing from natural disaster
- Still enjoys its government's protection

ASYLUM SEEKER

- Person who left country
- Applied for refugee status
- Awaiting decision on their application
- Not to be confused with refugee
